Prime Stage Theatre Hosts a Series of Professional Development Workshops That Explore Creative Inquiry

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Pittsburgh, PA, August 31, 2011 – Prime Stage Theatre, who for the last 15 years has been entertaining and educating adults, families, students and educators has announced a new series of workshops that explore Creative Inquiry for Literacy Learning.

Their new Education Director, Christina Farrell, will lead the workshops which will provide teachers with the tools to create interactive lessons that excite, engage and expand their students' love of learning. Participants will actively explore theater techniques that can be used in the classroom to spark curiosity and personal meaning-making for teen readers. Teachers will learn how to develop their own inquiry-based lesson plans and attain resources to support ongoing creative questioning in the classroom.
