She has taught at Hope Academy for the Performing Arts in East Liberty and was a Drama Instructor at South Park High School where they obtained Gene Kelly Best Musical and Lighting 2004 nominations. In addition, Haston taught Intro to Performance at the University of Pittsburgh 2009 Fall/Winter/Spring Semester.

Along with teaching, Haston participated with the implementation of the Heinz Endowment Culturally Responsive Arts in Education (CRAE) Program in the Public School System. This program, based out of Chicago, is an initiative introduced in five public schools in Pittsburgh. The program employs the arts of the African Diaspora to partner teachers with arts in order to develop an instructional climate that promotes a positive racial identity. It also forges collaboration among arts specialists, teaching artists, and teachers of other core subjects and to develop leadership qualities and appreciation of the arts within the children.

As part of the educational department, the Literacy in ACTION Program is designed to help teachers in underserved districts of our region transform their reluctant and struggling adolescent students into students who can read, are motivated, find value and enjoyment in a variety of literature.
