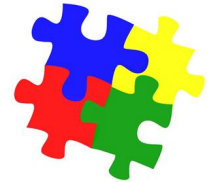


# What does a Sensory Friendly Performance look and sound like?



Prime Stage has been presenting Sensory Friendly performances for three years. Through our partners with the Special Education Program at Slippery Rock University, Autism Society of Pittsburgh, and Autism Speaks, we provide a welcoming space for adolescents, young adults, and adults on the autism spectrum.

The performance is the same as our other performances with these accommodations to make your visit to Prime Stage enjoyable and memorable as we encourage you to attend many times as literature comes to life on stage!

- + You are able to bring water and small treats into the theatre during the performance.
- + We provide fidgets, earplugs, and noise cancelling ear-muffs for you.
- + Trained volunteers with special T-shirts are here to assist you when needed.
- + You are able to bring manipulatives, seat cushions, comfort objects and extra support items into the theater.
- + You are able to leave and return to your seat if needed during the performance.
- + We keep the house lights on a dim level.
- + We reduce loud or jarring sounds.
- + You meet some of the actors before the performance and after the show.
- + Quiet spaces are available in the lobby.
- + Free indoor parking is provided to you by our funders.
- + Family restrooms are provided.
