### ***Prime Stage Theatre Announces their 2022-2023 Season of Suspense, Hope and Wonder***

(Pittsburgh, PA – September 20, 2022) Prime Stage Theatre's 26<sup>th</sup> season brings literature to life with new productions, continued partnerships, an expanded Prime Stage Sprouts program and a new installment of our interactive mystery podcast series.

"Our 26th season is designed so everyone can enjoy literature being brought to life at the New Hazlett Theater with our partnerships, mainstage performances, accessibility performances, the partnership with the Holocaust Center that reaches local, national and international audiences, and our special Sprouts Children's Theatre Series for younger audiences and families," said **Wayne Brinda**, Prime Stage Theatre, Producing Artistic Director.

Early in November with Halloween still in the air, the new season opens with a classic tale with a new twist. This world premiere production of Mary Shelley's ***Frankenstein*** follows the epic chain of events that led to the creation of life and asks who really is the monster?

Adapted by Pittsburgh's own **Lawrence C. Connolly**, an acclaimed sci-fi/mystery author, you will see eighteen-year-old Mary Shelley create one of the most horrifying and suspenseful stories ever written as Dr. Frankenstein brings the Creature to life.

This vivid imaginative science fiction story is perfect for Connolly whose stories have appeared in the magazines *Amazing Stories* and *Rod Serling's Twilight Zone*, some of which were reprinted in volumes of *Year's Best Horror Stories*, edited by Karl Edward Wagner.

Eighteen-year-old Mary Shelley is one of five friends that take shelter in a Swiss mansion as a storm rages. Before the night is over you will see her conceive one of the most horrifying and suspenseful stories ever written.

Connolly also writes and performs the Mystery Theatre podcasts for Prime Stage Theatre. The new chapter podcasts will be released during the run of *Frankenstein*. Listeners become part of the story as they follow the clues providing feedback to the author to contribute to the story as it is created.

The production is directed by **Liam Macik**, a Pittsburgh native and graduate of Mount Lebanon High School and a BA in Theatre Arts from Catawba College in Salisbury, NC.

Macik served as the founding Artistic Director of Throughline Theatre Company for seven years, where his directing credits include productions of *Judgement at Nuremberg*, *Oedipus Rex*, and *The Last Days of Judas Iscariot*. Macik directed last season's production of Prime Stage Theatre's *Arsenic and Old Lace*.

April brings the world premiere of ***Perseverance*** to the stage - a powerful memoir of healing and renewal. Few visitors to the G&S Jewelry Store in Pittsburgh's Squirrel Hill neighborhood during the 1960s and '70s were aware that the cheerful proprietor, Melvin Goldman, had spent his teens enduring the horrors of Auschwitz before arriving as a penniless refugee in postwar Pittsburgh intent on reshaping his family's destiny. Adapted for the stage by L.E. McCullough from the book by Melvin Goldman and Lee Goldman Kikel, *Perseverance: A Holocaust Survivor's Journey from Poland to America* depicts Goldman's irrepressible spirituality, unflagging love for humanity, and perseverance as he worked to replace Darkness with Light, one shop patron at a time.

Each year through the power of theatre and partnerships Prime Stage Theatre and the Holocaust Center of Pittsburgh **enGAGE** the world in education, understanding and actions against the atrocities of genocide. *Perseverance* is this year's **enGAGE** production
