The production is based on the The Boxcar Children Series, the first book of which was written in 1924 by first-grade teacher Gertrude Chandler Warner. More than a hundred books followed the iconic original, most devoted to the Boxcar kids as mystery solvers.

As well as her books in *The Boxcar Children* series, Warner wrote many other books for children, including *The World in a Barn* (1927), *Windows into Alaska* 192), *The World on a Farm* 1931)and *Peter Piper, Missionary Parakeet* (1967). For adults she wrote *Life's Minor Collisions* to help adults solve the hard things the adults were going through.

"The secret to The Boxcar Children series of children's books longevity is the inherent theme that Henry introduces through the line, 'We Aldens stick together like glue.' We all spend our life seeking family and friends that we can have lasting, healthy relationships with. We begin this story with the children becoming orphans through the sudden death of their parents. The story unfolds with very simple lessons about how we can deal with challenges of loss by relying on those people around us that we identify as our "glue." The children show us how to focus on the needs of their siblings, not themselves. In taking care of each other, they begin to move forward through their loss, ultimately finding new relationships to celebrate," said Laura Wurzell, Director.
